Mrs. Manupelli wants to pursue all avenues, and stated the Town has enough affordable housing with 40B mixed and she would like to see something directed to just Seniors and disabled.

Kristine Pecora, 24 Country Club Road inquired about Peabody Court and was told it was owned by the state.

Mr. Carroll inquired about linking the two parcels together. Mr. Pearce responded the size and scope of the project will have to limited to something the Town can afford. Mr. O'Leary stated

the impact on the neighborhood would have to be evaluated.

Maureen Doherty, Editor, North Reading Transcript talked about LIFE at Lynnfield, which is owner occupied. She further stated the Town of Lynnfield sold it to a corporation.
