Ipswich River Park (IRP)

Nearing its 30th anniversary, Ipswich River Park is a regional landmark and local treasure. It was originally purchased and developed by the Hillview Enterprise, a townowned, independently operated golf & function facility.

April 1993: Town Meeting authorized the Hillview to acquire and develop the land as recreational property.

Fall 1996: IRP opened with additional funding from a state Urban Self-Help grant and fundraising by the Land Utilization Committee.

Summer 2023: Look for tennis, hockey and basketball court resurfacing with grants secured by our state legislators Rep. Brad Jones and Sen. Bruce Tarr, as well as from Parks department revenue. Your donations and rentals of IRP space help us maintain this beautiful park.
